GRAND FINAL CLIFFHANGER TO RAMBLERS

A rushed point in the time-on period gave Ramblers their fourteenth consecutive premiership victory in the Great Flinders Football League on Saturday.

Ramblers defeated minor premiers Tumby who were playing their first season in the Great Flinders League. Before a crowd of approx 2000 people Tumby won the toss and kicked to the northern end that was favoured by a two to three goal cross breeze. Tumby used the breeze well and goals from Kroemer, Lamshed, Burton and Dunn saw them capture a handy 22-point lead at the first break. Ramblers hit back hard in the second term adding four majors of their own and at half time the Magpies held a slender 1-point advantage. An even third term eventuated with both teams fighting hard for supremacy. Mail Medalist Brenton Lamshed had a purple patch and was in everything as Burton and Harris goaled for the Double Blues to see them steal a mini-break on the Magpies who fought back late in the term adding two late goals to trail by just 2-points at the final change. The whole ground was electric as the two sides gave every piece of effort they had left in a frantic last quarter. Ramblers eventually broke the dead-lock to kick the first goal of the quarter but Michael Harris quickly replied for Tumby and scores were all tied-up with only a few minutes left on the clock. The Double Blues attacked hard but opportunities went begging - a missed handball under pressure and no support for a running player. Ramblers moved the ball forward and managed to rush a point and shortly after the siren sounded ending one of the best grand finals ever witnessed in Great Flinders Football.
